- *Cardboard and metal are collected separately from Zero Sort so that the town can market them and get some revenue.*
- *Deposit bottle and cans continue to be collected for the school.*
- *Most Batteries will be accepted directly by the Transfer Station attendant.*
- *Hazardous materials such as liquid paint, oil, many household liquids are not accepted. Dried paint cans may be recycled in the Metal container.*
